BETWEEN

Prajwala, a pioneering anti-trafficking organisation in India dealing with prevention, rehabilitation, rescue and reintegration of victims of sexual crimes located at Survey No 64/2, 65/3, Basavaguda Road, Mankhal Village, Maheshwaram, Rangareddy - 501359.

AND

Ms. Anita Abraham, Associate Professor, VGDC, Vidyanagar, Hyderabad, residing at House No. 37-93/123, Road No. 04, Madhura Nagar, Neredmet, Hyderabad, Telangana - 500056.

WHEREAS the Consultant is professionally qualified person in the field of personality development and management, Capacity building, Leadership training, etc.

AND WHEREAS Prajwala is an anti-trafficking organisation working on the issue of sex trafficking and sex crime, with pan India and international operations.

AND WHEREAS Prajwala has planned to organize 04-day staff capacity building workshops for shelter team on team building, teamwork, leadership, counselling skills, etc for a project supported by SNF.

AND WHEREAS Consultant has agreed to enter into this AGREEMENT and proposes to work with Prajwala in coordinating, planning, and organising capacity building workshops for shelter team (04 days) (Hereinafter referred to as the "ASSIGNMENT").

Terms and Conditions of the agreement:

1. This AGREEMENT will be valid for a maximum period of 01 year, from 24th September 2019. It may be renewed by mutual consent of both Parties, depending on the fulfilment of objectives of this AGREEMENT.
2. Purpose of the agreement is planning and organising the capacity building training workshops for shelters team those who are directly dealing with victims of sex trafficking and sex crime.
3. Prajwala shall pay Rs 50,000/- (Rupees: Fifty thousand only). All the payments will be made by NEFT transfer / online transfer. 100 % payment as advance on signing of the agreement. The amount includes cost of training materials and other

4. Prajwala shall deduct 10 % as TDS from Fees of Rs. 50,000/- and shall provide form 16A against TDS Deducted to the second party to claim the refund from income tax by filing of returns.

Consultant further agrees to return all Prajwala's Confidential Information at the end of service or whenever requested by Prajwala.
8. Prajwala may terminate this Contract at any time due to failure of Consultant in accomplishing the activities and responsibilities set out in this Contract to the reasonable satisfaction of Prajwala. This will include failure to deliver any item of the services by its deadline date.
9. Furthermore, Consultant shall deliver to Prajwala all finished and/or unfinished work produced by Consultant pursuant to this Contract prior to the date of termination.



This Memorandum of Understanding is made and executed on 12th February 2020 at Hyderabad.

BY AND BETWEEN

Vivekananda Government Degree College, Vidyanagar, Hyderabad, Telangana, its administrators, assigns and successors represented by Ms. S. Nirmala, Principal Who is duly authorized to sign and execute the MoU.

Being the First Part

AND

Urban Rebox IT Pvt Ltd, an authorized agency of ITC having its principal office situated at No. # 11-3-362/3, Mohammadguda, Secunderabad, Hyderabad-500061 and Represented by Mr. V Sai Prateek, hereinafter referred as "Urban Rebox"

Being the Second Part

Whereas Vivekananda Government Degree College, has agreed to collect and give away the dry recyclable waste including any kind of paper waste and old records generated in its college and form Swachh WOW Hyderabad Chapter.

1. NOW THIS MOU WITNESSETH AS UNDER:

This is an agreement for a synergic alliance between Vivekananda Government Degree College and Urban Rebox for the social cause of recycling of Dry Waste and Environment Protection through recycling.

2. Time period: This MOU shall be for a period of one year commencing from the date of signing of this MOU.

3. Roles and Responsibilities of Vivekananda Government Degree College:

1. To ensure source segregation of dry and wet waste at College premise through its Teaching staff, housekeeping staff and Students.
2. Vivekananda Government Degree College will give away any kind of paper waste, dry recyclable waste and old records to Urban Rebox at price agreed mutually. URBAN REBOX will pay Rs.7/kg for any kind of Paper waste and old records and Rs. 2/kg for Plastic Waste (pet bottles, polythene bags etc..)

3. Vivekananda Government Degree College shall form Swachh WOW Hyderabad Chapter in the college with Student Volunteers and adopt nearby Schools or Colonies to promote Source Segregation through student volunteers.
4. Vivekananda Government Degree College shall provide students for Internship in WOW Program.
5. Vivekananda Government Degree College shall motivate students to bring dry recyclables like paper, plastic, metal etc. from their home and donate to WOW initiative.
6. Vivekananda Government Degree College will put up color coded bins for waste segregation at different points in College premises.

4. **Roles and Responsibilities of URBAN REBOX:**

1. ITC-MARI will train the students and housekeeping staff on source segregation and through them inculcate the habit of source segregation among the other students.
2. URBAN REBOX will collect dry recyclable waste and old records from Vivekananda Government Degree College and bring to the Dry Resource Collection Centre (DRCC) without any spillage.
3. URBAN REBOX shall coordinate with ITC and undertake necessary measures for dispatch of the sorted recyclables for recycling at its own cost.
4. URBAN REBOX will make payment to Vivekananda Government Degree College directly into their accounts for the dry recyclable waste collected against the accurate weighment and the type or category of the dry waste. The payment shall be made no later than 15 days from the date of purchase of dry waste from the waste collector. Franchisee on the request of Vivekananda Government Degree College may give New Notebooks and Stationery against the value of dry recyclable waste lifted.

5. **Performance of Obligations**

1. The details laid out in this MOU, notwithstanding the essence and spirit of this MOU is an understanding between Vivekananda Government Degree College and URBAN REBOX.
2. Any notice or other communication under or in connection with this agreement shall be in writing in the English language and shall be delivered personally or sent by way of e-mail to the party due to receive the notice or communication at its address set out in this contract or such other address as either party may specify by notice in writing to other.

6. Execution of this Agreement shall be deemed to be

- a) A confirmation by both the parties that no benefit, either in cash or kind has been provided by either party to the other party or to any officer or employee, or any relative/ associate of any officer or employee of either party or of any of their associate institutions/companies in order to enter into this Agreement, and
- b) An undertaking by both the parties not to provide any benefit, either in cash or kind to any officer/employee/relative/associate of any officer or employee of either party as reward or consideration either for entering into this MOU or other matter relating to this Agreement.

7. Other Terms:

Force Majeure: Neither party shall be liable for damages for any delay or failure to perform its obligations here under, if such delay or failure is due to reasons beyond



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the control of the concerned party including without limitation, strikes, riots, wars, fires, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, unusually severe weather, earth quakes, explosions, acts of God or state or any public enemy or acts mandated by applicable laws, regulation or order, whether valid or invalid, of any Governmental body.

8. **Dispute Resolution:** It is understood by both the parties that this Agreement is for a social cause and not to make any profit out of the understanding. The Parties covenant that they will comply with all applicable laws and regulations in their conduct pursuant to this Agreement. Any dispute arising out of this Agreement shall be first attempted to settle amicably between the parties.

9. **Arbitration**

Any dispute which is not resolved amicably shall be finally settled by binding arbitration in respect to the matters concerning to the MOU with the Sole Arbitrator to be appointed by the mutual consent of both the parties. The Parties agree that the decision or award resulting from arbitration shall be final and binding upon the Parties.

Pending the submission of and/or decision on a dispute, the Parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under this Agreement without prejudice to a final adjustment in accordance with such arbitration award

10. **Governing and Jurisdiction:** This Agreement is subjected to the Jurisdiction of Courts at Hyderabad.
- Both the parties shall agree that it will not make use of, disseminate, or in any way disclose any confidential information to any person, firm or business. Furthermore, the existence of any discussions, negotiations or agreements in progress between the parties shall not be released to any form of public media without written approval of both parties.

11. **Amendments**

This Agreement and the Schedules together constitute a complete and exclusive understanding of the terms of the Agreement between the Parties on the subject hereof and no amendment or modification hereto shall be valid and effective unless agreed to by all the Parties hereto and evidenced in writing.

12. **NOTICE /Termination**

Any notice required to be given hereunder shall be given in writing at the address of each party set forth as below in this agreement or to such other address either party may substitute by written notice to the other. Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving 30 days written notice to the other party.




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

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Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU)
Between
Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana
And
HireMee

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into and effective as of 6th June 2018, by and between:

HireMee, a unit of KAAM Services Private Limited a company incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, and having its registered office at No.483, Seetha Complex, 16th cross, RR Nagar, Bengaluru-560098, Karnataka, India, and hereinafter unless the context otherwise requires, be referred to as "**HireMee**";

And

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Hyderabad having its registered office at 2nd Floor Vidya Bhavan, Opposite to Latha Talkies, Nampally, Hyderabad-500001 and hereinafter unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "**CCETS**".

Whereas:

CCETS and HireMee have entered into discussions on HireMee's provision of free technology assistance to CCETS, for job placements for students of CCETS approved Colleges. HireMee serves as a Virtual Bridge between Recruiters and Aspiring Applicants esp. of Tier-2 and Tier-3 areas. HireMee is an end-to-end Web Portal and Mobile App developed with intent to reach out to all students, recruiters and colleges across the country in these areas who will benefit from using the HireMee. Students, Colleges, Corporates and Recruiters can register through HireMee Portal, and assessments are directly carried out by HireMee. The entire recruitment process will be seamlessly linked on a chain.

HireMee and CCETS desire to enter into this Memorandum setting out the terms and conditions under which the purpose and scope of this MOU will be achieved.

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Article 1 Effective Date

The Parties hereby agree that the Effective date of this MOU shall be the date on which it is signed. The preamble to this Agreement constitutes an integral part thereof.

ARTICLE 2 Purpose and Scope

Purpose: This MOU outlines the mutual cooperation between the two parties for helping in bridging the gap in employability skills by imparting suitable training especially, in rural areas; help the academia to understand the gap in skills and support them with industry specific inputs; and provide an opportunity to the all students by connecting them to the right jobs.

This is a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) effort to discover diamonds in students in rural and urban colleges free of cost.

Role and scope of cooperation: The Parties agree to, in the spirit of mutual cooperation, use the best efforts towards fulfillment of their respective obligations in achieving the purpose of this MOU.

This MOU outlines the commitments of both the Parties.

2.1 Commitments of CCETS:

- Informing all CCETS approved college Principals about HireMee's services and act as a platform for helping students find employment opportunities by linking industries for hiring.

- Support HireMee by allowing to put posters and other awareness material for colleges to disseminate the information to students across campus on bulletin boards, notice boards, emails, etc.


2.2 Commitments of HireMee:

- Provide the free online and app based platform www.hiremee.co.in for Students and Recruiters to find the best students for jobs.

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- Provide access to web portal and mobile app by all students studying in CCETS-approved colleges and help them in getting placements.
- Help academia to understand the gaps in skills and areas of improvement
- Help bridge the gap in specific employability skills especially in rural areas and support them with industry specific inputs.
- Support CCETS in increasing awareness of www.hiremee.co.in among students, colleges and universities by providing the required materials.

ARTICLE 3 Confidentiality

- 3.1 This document is confidential. Both the parties agree to maintain in confidence, and not reveal to any person or body, rights and obligations of the Parties or any information or data which it receives through the other Pursuant to this Agreement. The provision of Confidentiality shall survive the termination of this MOU and continue to bind the parties.
- 3.2 Both parties hereby declare that they know that this undertaking will be in force during the validity of this MOU, as well as at any time after this MOU is terminated.
- 3.3 Both parties declare that they know that the undertaking pursuant to this agreement is a pre-requisite for each party to enter into this MOU with the other, and that without this declaration each would not be willing to enter into an agreement with the other.

Article 4 Intellectual Property

- 4.1 Intellectual Property means all systems, processes, procedures, proposition descriptions, models, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and patents, utility models, methods and other intellectual property rights recognized in any jurisdiction worldwide, including all applications and registrations.
- 4.2 This understanding will be operational and valid for 3 years from the date of signing or until the date of earlier termination upon completion of 3 years MOU can be renewed with mutual consent of both parties.

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Either party may terminate this agreement by providing notice of at least 30 days in advance in writing to the other party at the official address for communication.

- 4.3 The Materials provided by HireMee are protected by copyright, including without limitation by Copyright Law and other applicable laws in India.
- 4.4 CCETS & HireMee will not reveal, make use of or commercialize any of the confidential information provided by HireMee/CCETS either during the currency or after termination of the related Agreement for a period of 5 years.
- 4.5 HireMee will retain the right of ownership to all the Intellectual Property Rights, processes, protocols, propositions and models of HireMee, even though CCETS may have amended and added to the foundation Intellectual Property.

ARTICLE 5 General Provisions

- 5.1 Both Parties agree to maintain at all times, a one-point contact for undertaking and overseeing the initiatives listed out in this MOU. Any change in the contacts will be promptly notified to the other Party.

- 5.2 This MOU references good faith efforts by both CCETS and HireMee and is an expression of the Parties' current intent and recognizes the fact that the execution of some of the terms of the MOU could require the Parties to enter into definitive agreements. It is understood that without such definitive agreements, the terms of the MOU are not legally binding and will not be relied upon by any party for any purpose and no party is or will be bound by the terms of this MOU, unless and until definitive agreements are signed.

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- 5.3 **Terms and Termination:**
The Terms and Conditions agreed under this MOU shall commence on 6th June, 2018 and shall remain in effect until terminated.
- 5.4 **Amendments:** Either party may request changes to this MOU. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this MOU which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this MOU shall be incorporated by written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by all parties to this MOU.
- 5.5 **Applicable Law:** The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this MOU shall be governed by the laws of India. The courts of Bangalore shall have jurisdiction over any action arising out of this MOU and over the parties, and the venue shall be Bangalore, India.
- 5.6 This MOU supersedes all prior oral or written communication, discussions and representations communicated between the parties hereto in respect of the subject matter of this MOU.
- 5.7 Any notice under this MOU will be in writing and delivered by hand or by registered post acknowledgement due, to the other party at the registered office or as may be substituted by the notice. If any notice sent by e-mail, post will be effective on the date of receipt.
- 5.8 **Severability:** Should any portion of this MOU be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the MOU shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
- 5.9 **Third Party Beneficiary Rights:** The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of a third party beneficiary, and this MOU shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this MOU shall operate only between the parties to this MOU, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this MOU. The provisions of this MOU are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this MOU. The parties to this MOU intend and expressly agree that only parties signatory to this MOU shall have any legal or equitable right to seek to enforce this MOU to seek any remedy arising out of a party's performance or failure to perform any term or condition of this MOU, or to bring an action for the breach of this MOU.





Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana having its office at 3rd Floor, Prof. Jayashankar Vidya Bhavan, Nampally, Hyderabad - 500001, hereinafter unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "**CCETS**"

As FIRST PARTY

And

StoryTech Private Limited, incorporated in September 2016 as a startup by professionals with academic qualifications and experience in the field of software development. It is represented by its Founder & Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Manikanth Challa with their Registered Office located at Flat No - 202, Shreya Blossom, Plot No-185A, Road No-15A, Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad - 500033, Telangana, India and hereinafter unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "**SPL**",

As SECOND PARTY

(Both Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as a "Party")

Introduction:

A. Whereas CCETS is a non-profit department created by the Government of Telangana State to promote education, giving special attention to backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at under graduation level especially for underprivileged sections of the society.

B. StoryTech Private Limited is a startup which aims at development of dynamic, flexible and scalable solutions or challenges in domains to arrive at integrated solutions for arriving at measurable impacts.

C. CCETS and SPL have entered into discussions on SPL's Digital Employment Exchange of Telangana's (DEET's) provision of technological assistance to CCETS in the areas of placement services, skill enhancements, trainings in the emerging horizons, interview & employment success factors


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including but not limited to Curriculum Vitae (CV) building etc. for students/jobseekers.

D. SPL's DEET is an end to end web portal and mobile app developed with an intent to connect all stake holders i.e., students/jobseekers and recruiters across the state of Telangana in the above-mentioned areas. The stakeholders can register through SPL (DEET) portal. Assessments are directly carried out by SPL (DEET). The entire recruitment process will be seamlessly linked on a chain.

E. The parties share the common interest of engaging in creating a platform that connects academia and industry with the objective of providing employment opportunities to students by connecting them to the right jobs.

SPL and CCETS desire to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding setting out the terms and conditions under which the purpose and scope of this MoU will be achieved.

Article 1 Effective Date

The parties hereby agree that the effective date of this MoU shall be the date on which it is signed. The preamble to this agreement constitutes an integral part thereof.

Article 2 Purpose and Scope

Purpose: This MoU outlines the mutual cooperation between the two parties which shall create an ecosystem, to bridge the gap between industry and academia through need-based trainings to the job aspirants that shall support them with industry specific inputs, and provide opportunities to all, to achieve the right job.

Role and scope of cooperation: The parties agree to, in the spirit of cooperation, use the best efforts towards fulfilment of their respective obligations in achieving the purpose of this MoU.

This MoU outlines the commitments of both the parties.

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2.1 Responsibilities of CCETS:

- Instruct all Government Degree Colleges working under its ambit:
 - to partner with SPL for DEET activities
 - support awareness activities on SPL (DEET) and disseminate the information to the students through display of posters/other awareness materials/circular/e-mail/bulletin board notices and any other medium that provides similar and suitable benefit
- Recommend and encourage all Government Degree Colleges under its purview to motivate their students to utilize the services of SPL (DEET).

2.2 Responsibilities of SPL (DEET):

- Provide online and app-based platform (website) for students of Government Degree Colleges approved by CCETS and recruiters to find the best candidates for jobs.
- Jobseekers shall have the option of skill enhancements, trainings in the emerging horizons, interview & employment success factors, Curriculum Vitae (CV) building and other facilities on chargeable basis. SPL shall provide these options subject to terms and conditions, with consent of the jobseekers.
- Provide assistance to understand the gaps in employability skills and areas of improvement, with industry specific inputs.
- Support CCETS in increasing awareness on www.tsdeet.com among students, colleges, jobseekers and universities.

Article 3

Term

The MoU shall be effective for a period of one year from the date of signing. The MoU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by parties.

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Article 4 Financial Liabilities

4.1 StoryTech Private Limited shall not charge any fee on whatsoever account/name either from the students or the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education or its affiliated institutions for job placements and internships.

4.2 Skill enhancement trainings and other corollary features will be charged by SPL subject to terms and conditions specified, with consent of the jobseekers, without any financial liability on CCETS or its affiliated institutions.

Article 5 Confidentiality

5.1 This document is confidential. Both the parties agree to maintain confidentiality and not reveal to any person or body, rights and obligations of the Parties or any information or data which it receives through the other pursuant to this agreement. The provision of confidentiality shall survive the termination of this MoU and continue to bind the parties.

5.2 Both parties hereby declare that they know that this undertaking will be in force during the validity of this MoU as well as at any time after this MoU is terminated.

5.3 Both parties declare that they know that the undertaking pursuant to this agreement is a pre-requisite for each party to enter into this MoU with the other, and that without this declaration, each would not be willing to enter into an agreement with the other.

Article 6 Intellectual Property

6.1 Intellectual Property means all systems, processes, procedures, proposition descriptions, models, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and patents, utility models, methods and other intellectual property rights recognized in any jurisdiction worldwide, including all applications and registrations.

6.2 The Materials provided by SPL (DEET) are protected by copyright, including without limitation by Copyright Law and other applicable laws in India.

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6.3 CCETS & SPL (DEET) will not reveal, make use of any of the confidential information provided by SPL (DEET)/ CCETS either during the currency or after termination of the related agreement for a period of 5 years.

6.4 SPL (DEET) will retain the right of ownership to all the Intellectual Property Rights. CCETS shall not use intellectual property that is in any way based on the systems, processes, protocols, propositions and models of SPL (DEET), even though CCETS may have amended and added to the foundation of Intellectual Property.

6.5 The data of the students should not be shared to anyone without the permission of CCETS other than for the project for which the students have registered.

Article 7 General Provisions

Both parties agree to maintain at all times, a one-point contact for undertaking and overseeing the initiatives listed out in this MoU, any change in the contacts will be promptly notified to the other party.

Terms and Termination: The terms and conditions agreed under this MoU shall commence on the date of signing and shall remain in effect until terminated. This MoU may be terminated by either of the Parties by giving not less than 3 months' notice in writing to the other Party.

Amendments: Either party may request changes to this MoU. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this MoU which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this MoU shall be incorporated by written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by all parties to this MoU.

Applicable Law: The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this MoU shall be governed by the laws of India. The Courts of Hyderabad, Telangana, India shall have jurisdiction over any action arising out of this MoU and over the parties, and the venue shall be in Hyderabad, Telangana, India.

This MoU supersedes all prior verbal or written communications, discussions and representations communicated between the parties hereto in respect of the subject matter of this MoU.

Any notice under this MoU will be in writing and delivered by hand or by registered post acknowledgement due, to the other party at the registered office or as may be substituted by the notice. Any notice sent by e-mail/post will be effective on the date of receipt.

Severability: Should any portion of this MoU be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the MoU shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.

Third Party Beneficiary Rights: The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of a third-party beneficiary, and this MoU shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and

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

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") is entered into this on 16th November 2018 by and between

The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana State, Vidya Bhavan, Nampally, (hereinafter referred to as "CCETS" which expression shall mean and include its heirs, successors, executors, administrators, authorized representatives and permitted assigns) as FIRST PARTY.

AND

Naandi Foundation, a Public Charitable Trust incorporated under the Indian Trusts Act, having its registered office at 502, Trendset Towers, Road No 2, Banjara Hills, Hyderabad - 500 034, Telangana, India represented by Shri. Raj Iyer, Chief Youth Employment Officer, through its authorized signatory (hereinafter referred to as "Naandi" which expression shall mean and include its heirs, successors, executors, administrators, authorized representatives and permitted assigns) as SECOND PARTY.

(Both Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as a "Party")

Introduction

WHEREAS CCETS is a non-profit organization created by Government of Telangana to promote education, giving special attention to the areas located in backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at undergraduate and post graduate level especially for women and underprivileged sections of the society.

WHEREAS Naandi Foundation is an apolitical, autonomous Public Charitable Trust and a not for profit organisation having registration under section 12AA of income tax act, 1961 is tax exempt and is recognised by tax authorities as an organisation established for 'charitable purpose'

WHEREAS Naandi is working with an objective of people centred development through its charitable activities in whole of India, without distinction of caste, creed or religion, etc



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WHEREAS Naandi engaged, inter alia, in improving the livelihoods of the underprivileged communities through its various social initiatives, developmental programs, in various states of India. Naandi's activities include, education to underprivileged children with a specific focus on girl child education, improving livelihoods of small and marginal farmers through its farming practices, employable training and skill development programs to underprivileged youth, provision of safe drinking water to communities, etc

WHEREAS Naandi, in furtherance of its objectives and as a part of its skill development program to underprivileged youth, wish to build and enhance the employability skill set of the underprivileged youth/students in colleges under the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education in the State of Telangana.

WHEREAS the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, in the State of Telangana, is desirous of engaging in employability skill building program of the underprivileged youth/students in Government Degree Colleges at undergraduate and post-graduate levels, in the State of Telangana.

WHEREAS both the parties having recognised each other's intention of supporting the underprivileged youth / students, studying in Government Degree colleges in the State of Telangana have decided to work together in the space of employability skill development initiative.

WHEREAS both the parties have decided to reduce the mutually agreed terms and conditions into writing

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS UNDER:

I: The employability skill development program (MPC)

- 1.1 The program shall be carried out in Government Degree and PG Colleges, in the State of Telangana. A list of such colleges/institutes is given in Annexure - I enclosed herewith which is a part of this MOU.
- 1.2 The beneficiaries/students shall be the underprivileged students studying in the final semester under this program in Government Degree and PG Colleges, in the State of Telangana.
- 1.3 The skilling program shall be for a duration of 40 hours or as the case may be decided mutually by the parties.
- 1.4 The program shall include Soft-Skills, Communication Skills, Life Skill and Interview preparations for the beneficiaries under employability skill development program. The


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beneficiaries may be trained in any other skill set, as mutually decided by both the parties, that improves their employable skill and livelihoods.

- 1.5 The first party or the respective college/institute/university shall select the beneficiaries/students for the said program.

II: Obligations of the First Party

- 1.1 Ensure that the necessary infrastructure like well-equipped class rooms are made available where the program shall be implemented.
- 1.2. Ensure that each of the selected colleges/ Institutes identify one resource person from their faculty to co-ordinate between the beneficiaries/students, the Institute management and the second party. Contact details of such identified resources shall be with the rest of the team.

III: Activities of the Second Party (Naandi):

- 1.1. Prepare content that will be most effective in training the beneficiaries/students.
- 1.2 Provide the first party a detailed Course Schedule containing curriculum and day wise lesson plans of courses to be conducted
- 1.3 Ensure that well-trained trainers are identified for each institute to ensure overall success of the Project.
- 1.5 Monitor the program by conducting periodic assessments to ensure that the trainers do a quality job.
- 1.6 At periodic intervals, give a narrative report to the first party with the challenges met, opinion about the program, suggestions for improvement and feedback from the trainees. Similarly, parameter-based impact evaluation report shall be prepared by second party and submitted to first party periodically on completion of trainings for all students. A consolidated impact report shall be submitted on evaluating impact at project intervention level.



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IV. TERM:

The MoU will be effective for a period of twelve months from the date of signing. The MOU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by parties.

V. Free of Cost:

The Program is free of cost. Naandi shall not charge any fees on whatsoever account/name either from the students or the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education - Telangana or its affiliated institutions, for conducting the aforesaid program.

VI. Certification:

Certificates shall be awarded by Naandi to the students on successful completion of the training and clearing of the assessment held post completion of the program.

VII. General Terms

Amendments to the MoU:

No amendment or modification of this MoU shall be valid, unless the same is made in writing by both the parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this MoU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made/ executed, unless otherwise agreed to.

Compliance with laws, statutes, rules and regulations of Government / local authority:

Both the parties shall comply with all laws, statutes and rules & regulations of Central and State Governments or Local authorities that may be applicable from time to time as required under this MoU.

Termination:

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana State, shall have the right to terminate the MoU, in case if the Naandi fails to fulfil their obligations as mentioned in the MoU, or violates any of the clause mentioned in the MoU.

Assignment :

Naandi shall not be entitled to assign any of its rights, benefits or obligations under this MoU without written consent of the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana State.

Relationship:

Nothing contained in this MoU will be construed as creating any agency, partnership, joint enterprise or other similar relationship between the parties. Neither party will have authority to contract for or



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

